Road Delays for the week of July 6-10, 2020

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Chip Sealing:

Drivers may encounter delays as the 2020 chip sealing operations begin **Wednesday, July 8 in the Castle Rock area.**

Chip sealing is the primary surface type throughout Cowlitz County. Crews place a thin layer of oil, followed by specific rock chips. Sweepers ensure an even rock application while a roller packs the rocks into the oil. Within a week crews will return to sweep any excess rock that has not bonded to the oil surface, often multiple times. The treatment is applied approximately every seven years to keep roads in good quality. Chip seal is a cost-effective preservation treatment. Flaggers will direct traffic during chip sealing operations.

Roads scheduled for Chip Sealing (in approximate order) include: McKee Road, Cook Ferry Road, Cemetery Road, Umiker Road, Conger Spur, Conger Road, Titus Road, Ogden Spur, Ogden Road, Cline Road, Armstrong Road, Military Road, Deweese Loop, Growlers Gulch Spur, Growlers Gulch Road, Cougar Flat Road, Ferguson Road, Vaness Road, Dixon Lane, Coyote Lane, P.H. 10, Quick Road, Larsen Lane, 2nd Avenue SW, Hibbard Street SW, Aden Street SW, 1st Avenue SW, D Street SW, Mosier Road, Fair Lane, Green Acres Drive and Green Acres Way.

Chip sealing operations are expected to continue in the Castle Rock area on Monday, July 13. Updated scheduling will be released next week. Subsequent schedules will include roads in the Longview, Kelso and Kalama areas. Maps by County area, of roads to be chip sealed, are available on the Public Works web page.

Road Striping:

Drivers may encounter slow moving paint striping trucks beginning **Tuesday, July 7 in northern portions of Cowlitz County.**

Motorists encountering the lead buffer truck are asked to wait until the last truck has passed before entering the roadway. Drivers behind, or travelling opposite of the painting operation, should not cross the paint lines. Per WAC 308-330-412, it is unlawful to drive across freshly applied markings. If vehicles do need to exit the roadway, they should proceed slowly at a 90 degree angle. Paint drying times will depend on weather, but it is generally dry within five minutes.

Tuesday, July 7 – Toutle, Silverlake and Castle Rock Area (in approximate order): South Toutle Road, Crabill Road, Luebke Road, Lapham Road, Fiest Road, Frank Smith Road, Slightly Road, Moore Road, Canal Road, Hall Road, Streeter Road, Shenandoah Drive, Sandra Road, George Taylor Road, Wiley Road, Kerr Road, Silver Shores Drive, Paine Road, Estes Road, Carnine Road, Schaffran Road, Hinch Road, Si Town Road, South Silver Lake Road (to Headquarters Road), South Silver Lake Acres Road, Schutt Road, Dahlman Road and Elwood Road.

Wednesday, July 8 – Castle Rock Area (in approximate order): Tower Road, Stillmeadows Lane, Storm Road, Finkas Road, Toutle River Road, River View Drive, Pumice Road, Kroll Road, Studebaker Spur #2, Studebaker Road, Old Pacific Highway North, Toutle Park Road, Burma Road, Caldwell Road, Barnes Drive, Imboden Road, and Dwight Road.

Thursday, July 9 – Castle Rock to Beacon Hill (in approximate order): West Side Highway, Chapman Road, Ryderwood area, Agren Road, Olequa Heights Road, Casey Road, Beebe Road, East Beebe Road, Gassman Road, Wren Loop Road, Sandy Bend Road, Blauser Road, Mull Road, Waters Road, Hicks Road, Hoyer Road, Cook Ferry Road, Rainbow Way, Sparks Drive, Shoreview Drive, Alpha Drive, Olson Road, Inglewood Drive and Nevada Drive.

Friday, July 10 – Longview Hillside and West Longview (in approximate order): Columbia Heights Road, South Nevada Drive, West Beacon Hill Drive, North Columbia Heights Road, Gorans Road, Parke Lane, Laulainen Road, Cedar Gates Road, Alpine Way, Lone Oak Road, Sunset Way, 37th Avenue, Sunset Drive, Monticello Drive, Montvale Way, Pacific Way, Clark Creek Road, North 50th Avenue, Pacific Terrace, 48th Avenue, Pennsylvania Street, Olympia Way, Ohio Street, 46th Avenue and 42nd Avenue (south of Ocean Beach Hwy).

Saturday, July 11 – Willow Grove, Coal Creek and Industrial Areas (in approximate order): Willow Grove Road, Barlow Point Road, Coal Creek Road, Woodside Drive, Carlon Loop Road, Ragland Road, Tanglewood Drive, West Port Way, International Way and Fibre Way.

Striping is expected to resume on Monday, July 13. The schedule for additional roads will be released when it becomes available.

Pavement Overlay Status:

Weather issues delayed the start of overlay paving that had been scheduled to begin July 1. Lakeside Industries, under contract with Cowlitz County, is now scheduled to begin the 2020 Countywide Pavement Overlay Project on Monday, July 6. Paving operations are expected to require four weeks to complete.

Roads scheduled for Overlay Paving (in approximate order) include: Hazel Dell Road, Melton Road, Monahan Road, Delameter Road, Parker Road, Headquarters Road, South Silver Lake Road, Dougherty Drive, Powell Road, Castle Rock Sports Complex, Martin's Bluff Road, Shirley Gordon Road, Green Mountain Road, Little Kalama River Road, Butte Hill Road, Insel Road, Finn Hall Road, Fredrickson Road, Merwin Village Road, Mill Creek Road, Oak Point Road, Cathlamet Road, Bunker Hill Road, Beacon Hill Road, Kool Road, Olsen Road, Norwood Drive, Pare Drive, County portion of Tennant Way and Maple Hill Road.

Flaggers will be present as one lane will be closed. Drivers should expect delays of up to 15 minutes between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. in the active work zones.

Please use caution near construction zones and obey the directions of construction personnel and traffic control devices. Note: Both chip sealing and road striping operations are weather dependent. Moisture and temperature conditions can slow or postpone operations. Projected schedules are approximate.

Paint striping, chip sealing, overlay paving, culvert replacements and road improvements are scheduled throughout the summer.
