Therapeutic Courts & Inmate Services

ADULT DRUG COURT

The Adult Drug Court Program is available to adult felony defendants and allows them to enter into treatment as an alternative to incarceration.

SAFE COURT (Juvenile Drug Court)

The SAFE Court Program was instituted to provide intensive, court-supervised, drug treatment options for juvenile offenders similar to the adult drug court program.

HOPE COURT (Family Treatment Court)

The HOPE Court Program was created to assist substance-affected parents in dependency proceedings to receive treatment in a supportive program with the end goal of returning their children to their custody

MENTAL HEALTH COURT

The Mental Health Court Program is for defendants whose behaviors can be directly linked to mental health issues and provides intensive case management to promote both treatment and public safety.

COMMUNITY COURT

The Community Court Program was created for low-level repeat offenders and designed to connect participants to community resources, support in accessing resources, and reduce recidivism.

JAIL SERVICES

Mental Health professionals provide mental health screenings, psychoeducation, crisis intervention, substance use treatment referrals, and psychiatric nurse practitioner services.

YOUTH SERVICES CENTER

Mental health professionals provide mental health screenings, crisis intervention, substance use treatment referrals, transition planning, and connection to community resources to youth in the juvenile detention center.

Community Based Programs

COMMUNITY HOUSE ON BROADWAY

Aug 1, 2017-July 31, 2019 \$261,562

Community House on Broadway is providing case management for homeless students, including behavioral support within the schools.

COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATES (CASA)

July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 \$225,000

Recruit, train, support, and oversee additional volunteer advocates to provide support to abused and neglected children in Cowlitz County.

COWLITZ COMMUNITY NETWORK

Aug 1, 2017-June 30, 2019 \$27,000

Cowlitz Community Network will provide assistance to local child care providers serving children with behavioral/emotional issues by bringing trainings to child care centers and/or parents around behavioral or developmental issues.

COWLITZ FAMILY HEALTH CENTER

July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 \$121,339

Provide permanent, supportive housing and voluntary case management services for women and children residing at Phoenix House. The Phoenix House serves mothers with a substance use disorder who have children and/or are pregnant and provides a wrap-around model which includes substance use treatment, mental health treatment, healthcare, domestic violence services, and sexual assault services.

EMERGENCY SUPPORT SHELTER

July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 \$80,722

Parent and child supportive services and educational opportunities to build skills in non-violent conflict resolution, positive social interactions, and healthy ways to understand and heal from impacts of violence/abuse.

LOWER COLUMBIA HEADSTART

July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 \$204,300

Columbia Wellness provides mental health services to support children in Headstart, Early Head Start, and ECEAP who experience emotional/behavioral challenges.

WSU EXTENSION

July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 \$68,075

The Strengthening Families Program is an evidence-based family skills training program for high-risk and general population families. The program is found to significantly improve parenting skills and family relationships, reduce problem behaviors, delinquency and alcohol and drug abuse in children and to improve social competencies and school performance.
