

Current Incident Management Structure	Current Incident Objectives
 The COVID Incident Management Team (IMT) is currently downsized to a Type 4 level The current staffing of the IMT includes (1) Incident Commander, (1) PIO, (1) Logistics & Planning, (1) Finance, (1) Operations w/ Public Health Staff 	 Provide for the safety and health of citizens and response personnel, including preventing and reducing morbidity and mortality from COVID-19. Provide an effective and proactive public relations and information strategy related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Inform stakeholder agencies of the preventive, preparative, and response efforts to minimize disruptions to the communities. Provide for the safe receipt, storage, and distribution of COVID-19-related commodities, especially PPE. Establish, maintain, and utilize surveillance to understand the current COVID-19 situation. Actively manage and control costs, apportioning costs by jurisdiction. Find a long-term solution and location for the PPE warehouse operation.

KEY UPDATES


- On 23 July, the Governor announced "Safe Start" rollbacks to some activities ---
 - Since 25 July, masks must also be worn in all public common spaces such as hallways and elevators in building and shared spaces in apartment complexes and nursing homes, etc.
 - Per 30 July, restaurants/taverns/bars: only household members dining indoors, no alcohol sales after 10pm, no indoor bar service, game areas closed.
 - Per 30 July, in gyms/fitness-centers only 5 people limit.
 - o Per 06 August, funeral and wedding ceremonies are allowed, but receptions for these are NOT allowed. Indoor ceremonies limit 20% capacity or max. 30 people, whichever is fewer.

- Based on the Governor's changes (see above) Phase 2 and Phase 3 of Safe Start <u>"What's Open" graphics</u> have been updated.
- On July 15th, the CDC updated their COVID-19 One-Stop Shop Toolkits <u>CDC COVID-19 Toolkit</u> featuring videos, social media, PSAs, print resources, checklists, FAQs and web resources
- On July 20th, State Secretary of Health John Wiesman announced that he is returning all COVID-19
 <u>Safe Start</u> applications from counties whose applications were put on pause including Cowlitz
 County's application to move to Phase 3. <u>Safe Start Applications returned to Seven Counties</u>.



- Are we finding more cases because we are doing more testing?
 - Are Cowlitz County Public Health's increased case counts the result of increased testing as opposed to a true increase in disease transmission in the community? When analyzing the County's test and case data from mid-May to mid-June it was found that during that time period, testing increased by only 7% while cases increased thirteen-fold. The primary driver of our increase in cases from mid-May to mid-June was the fact that more of our tests were positive, not because we were doing more testing.
