Cowlitz County collects a 1/10th of 1% mental health sales tax. This sales tax must be used for chemical dependency or mental health programs and therapeutic courts as legislated in state law (RCW 82.14.460).

## Where does this funding go?

The Cowlitz County Board of County Commissioners makes funding decisions and relies on Cowlitz County Health & Human Services (CCHHS) to administer the funds.
