It is important to remember that every statistic in this report represents a person who is missed by family and friends and is also a loss to our community.

PURPOSE/GOALS

The Cowlitz County Coroner's Office (CCCO) serves the county by investigating sudden, unexpected, violent, suspicious, and unnatural deaths. All members of the CCCO staff recognize that every death investigated involves grieving family members as well as friends and co-workers. Conducting timely and complete death investigations is necessary, in part, to assist those grieving people. Complete investigations also help families with the settling of issues such as estate and insurance claims as well as any criminal or civil action. Often questions come up long after the death that were not thought of at the time and complete and thorough investigations aid in the answering of these questions.

Deaths investigated by the CCCO include on-the-job deaths which are conducted in conjunction with the Washington State Department of Labor & Industries (L&I).

The CCCO also plays a role in public health by isolating and identifying the causes of deaths that might affect large groups of the population. If an infectious agent or toxin is implicated in a death, the CCCO works with Cowlitz County Public health and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) to ensure appropriate medical treatment is obtained.

In cases that are unexpected deaths outside of a medical facility, suspicious circumstances, homicide, suicide, drug related or traffic deaths the CCCO works closely with the jurisdictional law enforcement agency. The agencies conduct parallel investigations, cooperating fully with each other, while maintaining their independent roles. All members of the CCCO staff are subject to being subpoenaed to testify in civil/criminal cases as to the extent of the investigation conducted.
