2025 Pavement Overlay and Chip Seal Project Update

Drivers may encounter delays due to the ongoing 2025 Pavement Overlay and Chip Sealing Projects. For the weeks of Monday, June 30th through Friday, July 11th, Lakeside Industries, under contract with Cowlitz County, will be continuing with paving operations. The County Road crew will also continue with chip sealing maintenance operations. There will be no road work from Friday, July 4th through Sunday, July 6th.

Roads scheduled for Overlay Paving this week and next include (in approximate order): Rose Valley Road and Old 99 South (June 30th – July 3rd); China Garden Road, Green Mountain Road (July 7th – 11th) They are scheduled to pave on South Silverlake Road on Saturday, July 11th, as well.

Pavement overlay is scheduled to begin the week of July 14th on Dike Road in the Woodland area followed by Eufaula Heights Road in the Longview area.

Remaining roads scheduled are Harmony Drive, Stella Road, Woodside Drive, Coal Creek Road, Headquarters Road, Westside Highway, Kalama River Road, Todd Road (nighttime paving), and Old Pacific Highway (nighttime paving).

Roads scheduled for Chip Sealing this week and next include (in approximate order): Mt. Brynion Road on Monday, June 30th and Tuesday, July 1st. No chip sealing from will take place between July 3rd and July 6th. On Monday, July 7th, chip sealing will resume on Allen Street from Abbotsford Loop to the end of the county road. The crew will then move to the Longview area beginning on 50th Ave N, Pacific Terrace, and Clark Creek Road to finish the week.

Flaggers will be present as one lane will be closed. Drivers should expect delays of up to 20 minutes between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. in the active work zones during daytime work, and between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 5 a.m. during nighttime work.

Paving operations are dependent on weather and are expected to require approximately four to five weeks to complete. Updated scheduling will be released weekly. Thank you for your patience.
