WHEREAS, Administrative Services would like to sell the vehicles and equipment to other governmental agencies and/or contract with Richie Bros. Auctioneers of Olympia, Washington, to dispose of the vehicles and equipment by auction, at the discretion of Administrative Services.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Cowlitz County, Washington, gave notice of hearing, in accordance with the County Property Management Policy, of its intention to surplus and dispose of said property; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the notice, conducted a hearing on said proposition on the 20th day of September, 2016 at the hour of 10:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Chambers in the County Administration Building, 207 Fourth Avenue North, Kelso, Washington, at which hearing the public was given the right to be heard for or against the proposition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Cowlitz County, Washington, having fully considered the proposition, finds that said County-owned vehicles are not required for County purposes and that the public will benefit by declaring said equipment surplus and disposing of them in a manner consistent with the County Property Management Policy.
